13 thrust of my question is, once a senator or delegate has  
14 been elected, must he continue to live in his district?  
15 That is question number one; and while you are answering  
16 that one, also answer the question with respect to the  
17 exception: If he runs in a district in which he does  
18 not reside, must he then move into that district?

19 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Answering your second  
20 question, I think the answer is yes, that under the inter-
