2 was taken out of the committee's proposal and later  
3 was taken out of the first amendment to the proposal.  
4 I take it then that on this amendment, if we are going  
5 to follow the other precedents, that the only matter that  
6 would be before us would be the total number and the  
7 ratio of that number as between the senate and the house.  
8 Am I correct?

9 THE CHAIRMAN: The only way we could accomplish  
10 that with the amendment drawn the way it is is to  
11 separate the amendment into two parts, the first consisting  
12 of lines 8 down to and including the first two words of  
13 line 18, and the second one consisting of lines 18 to 21.

14 DELEGATE GILCHIRST: Yes, Mr. Chairman. I be-  
15 lieve it is susceptible of division.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Does Delegate Sherbow desire  
17 such division?

18 DELEGATE SHERBOW: I so move.
