2 Actually, I think as a matter of practice, the
3 Governor will in only very, very rare instances, if ever,
4 vest the Lieutenant Governor with the veto power, but I
5 certainly am not in favor of putting something special in
6 one section of the Constitution saying he can't do it under
7 this section, when he could get around it very easily and
8 do it under another section.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any further discussion?
10 Does any Delegate desire to speak in favor of the

13 DELEGATE GLEASON: Mr. Chairman and Fellow Dele-

18 when I read Section 4.16, page 6, this does say, if the
19 General Assembly is in session, a bill shall become law if
20 the Governor signs or fails to veto it.
