2 may be many reasons, many occasions where you require a
3 continuity of policy or you require regional representation
4 or representation of various interests.

5 I think it may be very necessary for the
6 legislature to have a board or a commission head a princi-
7 pal department of government in that case, and for that
8 reason I am opposed to the amendment, Mr. Chairman.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Any other delegate desire to speak
10 in favor of the amendment?

11 Delegate Boyce.

12 DELEGATE BOYCE: Mr. Chairman and delegates, I
13 think we basically are nitty-gritty as far as the
14 argument on the committee is concerned and Delegate Maurer
15 has made this a proposition to clean up what I think was
16 that of Delegate Raley and Pullen earlier, and I know there
17 has been a discussion trying to work it out.

18 I think this is an excellent solution of the
19 problem, and every time Delegate Morgan has mentioned the
20 need for a principal department of the state and needing
21 a Board he mentions the Chesapeak Bay fisheries or
