

1 committee report and my only effort was directed toward a
2 decision on the question of whether we were to have single
3 executives for all agencies other than education and I
4 would suggest that this is the key phrase that we are
5 voting on, and if you want single executives other than
6 education, you support Dr. Bard's amendment. If you
7 prefer to have a choice of whether you have boards in
8 education and elsewhere, then you vote against Dr. Bard's
9 amendment. I shall vote against Dr. Bard's amendment.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: I think the way you stated it,
12 Delegate Maurer, you had it in converse, not as to your
13 voting but as to the effect of it. If you desire to have
14 the legislature determine whether the head of a principal
15 department should be a single executive or a board, you
16 would vote for Delegate Bard's amendment.

18 DELEGATE STORM: This little new amendment that
19 has been offered, it seems to me, brings in one other thing
20 that you may not want to bring in. The present governor
21 and administration, I believe, has a formidable persuader
