

1 by the executive article of the Constitution or the power
2 of the governor to give messages to the General Assembly,
3 to veto bills passed by the General Assembly, return bills
4 to the General Assembly, to organize and reorganize the
5 executive branch of the government, to appoint and remove
6 the heads of principal departments to make other appoint-
7 ments and removals and to exercise executive clemency.
8 Those are the powers and functions which may not be dele-
9 gated to the lieutenant governor under this section.

13 as originally drawn up, the duties are prescribed by
14 law and presumably by being prescribed by law he could not
15 be assigned to duties other than those delegated him by

17 it the intention of this amendment to insure that the
18 lieutenant governor will not be able to perform any duties
19 other than those delegated to him by the governor or
20 would you still anticipate he could be assigned duties
21 which would be duties other than those which would be
