

1 DELEGATE GRANT: Mr. President, I have a
2 further question as a result of Delegate Bamberger's
3 question. Assuming that the governor would veto the
4 General Assembly plan and the commission plan would become
5 law, and then the commission plan would be found to be
6 illegal, or rather unconstitutional, would they then
7 look at the General Assembly plan? Would it go up or
8 would you contemplate it going up for the same double look?

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Gallagher.

10 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: No. I would not. If the
11 legislature did not act in sufficient time or was unable
12 to override the governor's veto, then the only live plan,
13 so to speak, would be the commission plan, and if that
14 were found to be illegal, then the Court of Appeals would
15 redistrict solely for the impending election, and then
16 the process would be repeated because the Commission and
17 the legislature would again have to get to the business of
18 drawing districts so that the Court of Appeals redistrict-
19 ing would be good for that election alone.

20 DELEGATE GRANT: You would not contemplate, then,
21 there would be any standing for the General Assembly plan
to be examined after the Commission plan, then?
