3 THE CHAIRMAN: Let the Chair state what he
4 understood Delegate Scanlan to indicate the purpose of the
5 amendment without trying to phrase it exactly and Delegate
6 Scanlan can correct the Chair if he is wrong.

7 He would propose to offer the amendment which
8 would forbid lotteries being conducted by or for a State
9 or political subdivision but would not include private
10 lotteries which would leave it to the Legislature to per-
11 mit or forbid private lotteries, is that correct?

12 Delegate Scanlan.

13 DELEGATE SCANLAN: Yes.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Churchill Murray.

15 DELEGATE E. C. MURRAY: Would this permit private
16 parties to operate a lottery, private parties beyond what
17 we normally have in mind in churches and fire halls and that
18 sort of thing.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Scanlan.

20 DELEGATE SCANLAN: If the Legislature permitted
21 it, the answer would be yes.
