4 of lots in which prizes are distributed to the winners,

7 the private operation of a raffle, a give-away, even the  
8 gasoline stations where you have to buy something to get  
9 a prize; it certainly would bar bingo and a host of other  
10 things.

11 The second definition, equally acceptable, is  
12 an event or affair whose outcome is or seems to be de-  
13 termined by chance.

14 I have been to a few horse races that might be  
15 covered by that definition. But it seems to me that this  
16 would give a power in the court that should be denied  
17 them.

18 There is no excuse for putting in the Consti-  
19 tution this type of prohibition unless one is to accept  
20 the suggestion of my good friend Delegate Malkus to bar  
21 all forms of gambling activity.
