

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Koss.

2 DELEGATE KOSS: The committee's intent was that  
3 this was a broad grant of power to the General Assembly  
4 and that they would exercise that mandate in a manner simi-  
5 lar to the way they had before.

6 I would suspect that my answer to Delegate Marion  
7 would have to be that the General Assembly could or  
8 could not, that they were under no mandate to require the  
9 Secrecy of the voting in a primary.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any further discussion?  
11 Delegate Weidemeyer.

12 DELEGATE WEIDEMEYER: Mr. President, on this  
13 amendment, Number 9, it occurs to me that while it may  
14 be a desire to give everybody the opportunity to vote, it  
15 is what I would call a floater voter amendment, but more  
16 serious than that, it doesn't do, if you look at line 20--  
17 it would not afford the right to vote as much as it  
18 claims, because if you struck out the three months in  
19 line 20 and inserted in lieu thereof 30 days, under the  
20 wording then, it would mean that a person who removed to  
21 another district after 30 days lost his right to vote in
