

1 DELEGATE CLARK: Delegate Bothe.

2 DELEGATE BOTHE: I am glad you asked the question,  
3 because I think that the record should be clear that we  
4 have no intention, although we have modernized the  
5 language and changed the order, we have no intention of  
6 altering the state of the law by so doing.

7 DELEGATE CLARK: Delegate Weidemeyer.

8 DELEGATE WEIDEMEYER: Mr. Chairman, is it not  
9 true that our Committee in all of these areas suggested  
10 by Delegate Hargrove meant that they shall have the right  
11 to be informed, that they shall have the right to be  
12 informed of the nature and cause of the accusation in time  
13 to prepare defense, they shall have the right to assis-  
14 tance of counsel, and of course that right can be waived,  
15 and we recognize that.

16 Also, they shall have the right to have  
17 compulsory process for obtaining witnesses -- whether  
18 they take advantage of it or not, they shall have that  
19 right -- and they shall have the right to have a speedy  
20 and public trial by an impartial jury of twelve without  
21 whose unanimous consent he shall not be adjudged guilty.
