

1 DELEGATE BARD: I would just like to announce
2 that in the balcony facing you there are members of the
3 Johns Hopkins University Class on Local and State Govern-
4 ment in Maryland.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: We are delighted to have you.

10 due process in connection with administrative procedures,
11 and if so, would you care to comment for the record on it.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Kiefer.

13 DELEGATE KIEFER: Due process, as we set it
14 forth in this proposal and as it is met in the First
15 Amendment and the 14th Amendment, applies to all actions
16 -- it says "no person shall be deprived of life, liberty
17 or property without due process of law."

18 This not only applies to a judicial proceeding,
19 but also to an administrative proceeding.

20 As you probably know, there is an administrative
