

1           The Chair is merely trying to put the matter  
2 in such a posture that appropriate amendments can be offered  
3 if desired.

4           Delegate Hardwicke.

5           DELEGATE HARDWICKE: I only suggest, Mr. Chairman,  
6 that the problem is more far-reaching than this particular  
7 provision. I don't think we should delude ourselves  
8 with regard to the extent to which we can change the plain  
9 import of the words.

10          THE CHAIRMAN: I quite agree, and the Chair did  
11 not mean to indicate by the statement of intent just given,  
12 to express an opinion that this is in any way binding upon  
13 the courts and will be followed by the courts. I was merely  
14 intending to indicate to the Committee of the Whole what  
15 is apparently the intent.

16          For what purpose does Delegate Clagett rise?

17          DELEGATE CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, to inquire  
18 whether Delegate Case will yield to a question.

19          THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Case, would you take the  
20 floor to yield to a question?
