

1 conceded there are some items which in the end may turn out
2 to be overstated.

3 For example, under Xerox, \$2,400, which
4 reproduces this plethora of material which inundates
5 us each day or did recently, again we are just going on
6 the daily cost basis of the amount of consumption. Whether
7 this will decrease or increase, I don't think is known.
8 Right now I think very frankly if you look at the figures
9 Mr. Martineau supplied us, it looks like this may have
10 been somewhat underestimated.

11 Of course, the really critical and expensive
12 item is printing, not only of the final printed edition
13 of the transcript of the proceedings in this Convention,
14 no one really knows what that will be, it will depend on
15 how long the Convention goes, how wordy we are, the form
16 of the transcript, and other matters.

17 The journal, of course, would be a less
18 expensive proposition, but there again the total amount of
19 the journal is uncertain. We have never had a journal
20 for a constitutional convention unlike the annual
21 journals of the legislature where there is recurring
