THE CHAIRMAN: The Chair will see that that is done. Delegate Key.

DELEGATE KEY: I am just wondering, what did we do with the correction that Delegate Case noted as to the inaccuracy of Number 1.

THE CHAIRMAN: All of that has been taken care of by the deletion of the word, "including," in line 12 and all of lines 13 to 28. Are you ready for the question? The question arises on the adoption of Amendment No. 10, as amended. A vote Aye is a vote in favor of the amendment as amended. A vote No is a vote against. Cast your votes.

Has every delegate voted? Does any delegate desire to change his vote? The Clerk will record the vote.

There being 115 votes in the affirmative and 3 in the negative, the motion is carried. The amendment is adopted.

Delegate Stern, the answer to your inquiry to the Chair is No.

The Chair recognizes Delegate Powers. Just a second. Delegate Storm.

DELEGATE STORM: Mr. Chairman, it will just take a second. We have come to the end of a day, I guess not all of us, none of us could say it was the end of a perfect day, but I believe on mature reflection we will be satisfied with ourselves for the work done. I think we have passed a tough time so I would like to ask when Chairman Powers makes his usual good-night motion, that he suggest that the Committee of the Whole rise and shine.

THE CHAIRMAN: The Chair suggests that we would all agree, it has been a long day. Delegate Powers.
