

ACTS OF ASSEMBLY.

The great seal to be affixed to all laws as before practised in this state—Const. art. 36.

In what manner they are to be signed and sealed—Const. art. 60.

Directed to be recorded in the general court office of the western shore, printed, published, and certified under the great seal to the several county courts, as hath been heretofore used in this state—Const. art. 60.

All laws thereafter passed, to be recorded in the court of appeals for the western shore—1804, ch. 55, sec. 5, 492

Correct copies of them to be furnished by the clerks of the senate and house of delegates to the printer of the state within thirty days after each session—1790, ch. 51, sec. 2, 262

The printer to print and pack up, under the direction of the governor and council, copies sufficient for the persons therein mentibned—1790, ch. 51, sec. 3. 262

Such copies to be deposited in the council chamber with the clerk of the council with sixty days from the receipt of the original copies, under the penalty of fifty pounds—1790, ch. 51, sec. 3, 263

The enacting style of the laws prescribed—Const. art. 57.

Acts of assembly, how to be published and confirmed, in order to alter the form of government, or declaration of rights—Const. art. 59.

The inhabitants of Maryland declared to be entitled to all acts of assembly in force on the first of June, seventeen hundred and seventy-four, except those expired or altered by acts of convention, subject to repeal, &c. by the legislature—Decl. of Rights, art. 3.

Directions for the annual printing of the laws by the printer to the state—1816, ch. 98, sec. 2, 640

Bond to be given for performing the duty—1816, ch. 98, sec. 3, . . . 641

The governor and council authorized and required to cause the laws to be forwarded to the different counties—1816, ch. 241, sec. 1, . . . 654

Appropriation therefor,—1816, ch. 241, sec. 2, 654

Former acts repealed—1816, ch. 241, sec. 3, 654

All acts of assembly which may relate to or affect the general administration of justice or the right of property, shall operate and have effect from and after the first day of June next, ensuing the time of the passage of such act—1837, ch. 261, 1257

Provided the general assembly shall have power by express words to declare that the act shall have operation on or after a different day—1837, ch. 261, 1257
