

Beginning June 1, 1935, and every fourth year thereafter, the Governor appoints a Board of three Commissioners, to be known as Commissioners for the Uniformity of Legislation in the United States, who shall represent Maryland in the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws. (Chapter 502 of the Acts of 1935.)

The duty of this Board is to examine into and ascertain the best means to effect uniformity in the laws of the States and especially to meet with representatives appointed by other States in a convention, known as "The National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws," to draft laws to be submitted for the approval and adoption of the several States, and to recommend such action as shall best accomplish promotion of such uniform legislation.

The Commissioners receive no salary but are allowed their actual disbursements for expenses.
