The Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, established in 1939, consists of five members appointed by the Governor for five-year terms, one term expiring each year. Four members must be professional engineers and one a practicing land surveyor. Land surveyors and professional engineers wishing to practice in the State of Maryland must apply to the Board for a certificate, supplying with their application evidence of their qualifications both in experience and training. Except when a written examination is mandatory, the Board may decide whether or not a particular applicant need take an examination. Through the cooperation of the local chapters of the engineering fraternities, the Board seeks to secure voluntary compliance with the law and the maintenance of the ethical standards of the profession. The Board is a member of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners, which aids in the reciprocal licensing of engineers and seeks to promote uniform standards of licensing in all States (Code 1957, Art. 75½, secs. 3-20).
