

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 18, of the Act entitled an Act to incorporate a Company to build a Turnpike Road from Libertytown, Frederick county, through Johnsville to Pipe Creek, chapter 338, passed January session, 1864, and re-enact the same with amendments.
