

for keeping, together with all expenses attending such sale, then to pay over the surplus, if any, to the owner of such horse, mare or gelding, or vehicle.

3. Before proceeding as above, it shall be necessary for such livery stable keeper to state an account for the keeping of such horse, mare or gelding, or vehicle, and prove the same before a Justice of the Peace for the county of Frederick, who upon being satisfied by proof of demand, and refusal or neglect to pay on the part of the owner, shall thereupon issue his warrant authorizing such sale as aforesaid; *provided*, that the proprietor of such livery stables shall set up on his premises, in some conspicuous place, a copy of the foregoing sections, printed in large type, and his rates of livery.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 156.

AN ACT, to amend the Act passed at the January session of the General Assembly of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter three hundred and twenty, entitled an Act, to incorporate the Trustees of the Parsonage, belonging to the Mechanicstown charge of the German Reformed church.

Section. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section three of the Act of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter three hundred and twenty, be, and is hereby, repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the congregation belonging to the Church above named, shall, annually, on the first Saturday in April, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, elect from their own membership, not exceeding seven Trustees.
