- April 12, 1871.—Anthony M. Johnson, County Commissioner, vice C. M. Roberts, resigned.
- May 12, 1871.—Elias Hobbs, Justice of the Peace 3rd district vice G. E. Flowers, failed to qualify.
- May 12, 1871.—Thos. B. Hobbs, Justice of the Peace 3rd district, vice P. Ridgely, failed to qualify.
- Oct. 7, 1871.—James Earp, Justice of the Peace 1st district, vice Edward Earp, resigned.
