CHAP. 109. ing the aforesaid road through his, her or their lands, shall thereupon proceed to assess and value the damages accordingly, taking into consideration the advantages and disadvantages, if any, and also any sum or sums of money already assessed, under the original act, for his, her or their use, and such inquisition shall be final and conclusive between the parties.

Sum to be levied

2. AND BE IT ENACTED. That the levy court of said county shall levy on the assessable property in said county, any sum or sums of money which may be assessed as damages aforesaid for the use of the person or persons for whom the same shall be assessed.
