CHAP. LXXVI.

*A Supplement to an act\*, entitled, An act authorising a Lottery to raise a sum of money for repairing Shrewsbury Church, in Kent County.* Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 97. Passed Jan. 25 1805

WHEREAS by an act of assembly which passed in the year eight-  
teen hundred and three, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to  
raise a sum of money for repairing Shrewsbury church, in Kent  
county, certain commissioners therein named were authorised to  
propose a scheme of a lottery for raising a sum of money for the re-  
pairs of the parish church, the enclosure of the burial-ground, and  
payment of debts before contracted for the repairs of said church:  
And whereas it is represented to this general assembly, by the pe-  
tition of the present vestrymen of Shrewsbury parish, that the com-  
missioners named in the said act consented to act, and complied  
with the provisions of the said act; that they proceeded, at a con-  
siderable expense, to propose a scheme of a lottery, to advertise the  
same, and to dispose of the tickets, but that in a short time there-  
after two of the commissioners appointed by the said act, to wit,  
Oliver Smith and Jacob Freeman, were attacked with severe bodily  
infirmary, and have since died, and that one other of the said com-  
missioners, to wit, George Yeates, removed from the county, and  
that another of the said commissioners, to wit, James Salisbury, be-  
came a member of the methodist society, so that there now remains  
only three of the original commissioners, to wit, William Briscoe,  
James Blakiston and Edward Wright, members of the said church,  
who not constituting a majority of the said commissioners, are in-  
capable of conducting the business of said lottery, agreeably to the  
provisions of the original act, and have prayed that a supplement  
to the said act may pass, revoking the appointments of the said  
George Yeates and James Salisbury, and to fill up the vacancies oc-  
casioned by the deaths of the said Oliver Smith and Jacob Free-  
man; which appearing reasonable to this general assembly, there-  
fore,

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That  
the appointment of the said George Yeates, and of the said James  
Salisbury, two of the commissioners appointed in the original act to  
which this is a supplement, be and the same are hereby vacated, and  
that Edward Eubanks, William Spencer, Benjamin Massey and  
John Lathrin, together with the said William Briscoe, and James  
Blakiston and Edward Wright, be, and they and each of them are,  
hereby appointed commissioners for the purpose contemplated by  
the said original act, and all the powers vested in the commission-  
ers appointed by the said original act be and they are hereby vest-  
ed in the commissioners above named, or a majority of them, in as  
full and ample manner as if they had been appointed by the said  
original act; *Provided*, that before the said commissioners herein  
named shall proceed to act as such, they shall enter into such bond as  
is required by the second section in the said original act, which said  
bond shall be recorded in the clerk's office of Kent county, and up-  
on an office copy thereof, a suit or suits may be instituted against  
the obligors therein, or any of them, or their or any of their legal
