

Governor's Proclamation Regarding The Election Of
Electors of President & Vice President
1920

I, Albert C. Ritchie, Governor of the State of Maryland, in pursuance of Section 3 of the Act of Congress, approved February, 1887, do hereby certify that from a certified copy of the Declaration of the Results of an election held in the State of Maryland on Tuesday, November 2, 1920, for the eighth Electors of President and Vice President of the United States, made and transmitted to me by the board of State Commissioners in accordance with law, and filed in my office, it appears that
