

WHEREAS, The papers filed with the superintendent of census show that certain of the said enumerators were entitled to receive greater compensation than could be allowed them owing to the inadequacy of the appropriation under said Act; now, therefore,

Appropriation not sufficient.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That the sum of four thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated to meet the deficiency as above mentioned, and the Comptroller and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to pay the said sum, or so much as may be necessary, to or upon the order of the person hereby authorized to be named by the Governor to carry out the provisions of this Act; provided, however, that in no case shall the allowance be made to any enumerator be in excess of the twenty days provided for under Chapter 3 of the Acts of 1901; provided, further, the person so named by the Governor to disburse the moneys hereby appropriated shall be the sole judge of the amount or amounts alleged to be due to any of the said enumerators.

Amount determined to be paid to cover the deficiency.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

#### CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT to amend the charter and grant additional powers to the Woman's College of Baltimore, a corporation incorporated under the General Laws of Maryland as amended by an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session in the year 1890, Chapter 325.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That the Woman's College of Baltimore be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to elect additional corporators, or members of said corporation, so as to increase the membership thereof to a number not exceeding fifty, the division of said corporation into classes and the terms of office and mode of election and of approval to be the same as was provided for the forty-five corporators by the Act of the General Assembly passed at the January Session of 1890, known as "Chapter 325 of the Laws of Maryland," all of the said corporators or members to be known and designated as the "Trustees of the Woman's College of Baltimore."

Womans College of Baltimore empowered to increase its board of corporators.
