CHAPTER 134.

AN ACT to repeal Section 98 of Article 5 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Calvert County," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 98 of Article 5 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Calvert County," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

Penalty for
violation.

98. Any person violating the provisions of the preceding section shall, on conviction, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than three hundred dollars for each and every offense, and be imprisoned in the House of Correction for not less than three months and not more than six months; and it shall be sufficient for the State in order to make out a *prima facie* case against the party so prosecuted, to prove the procuring or the possession or the exposing to view, by him or her, of a license for the sale of liquor from the Government of the United States; provided, however, that nothing in this Act shall be construed to repeal any of the provisions granted to the town of Chesapeake Beach.

CHAPTER 135.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Mayor and Council of Hagerstown, Maryland, to borrow the sum of seven thousand dollars by the issue and sale of bonds, the proceeds therefrom to be used in the construction, improvement and repair of drains and providing for the payment of the interest on such bonds and the principal thereof.
