

be and is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow a sum of money, not exceeding seven thousand dollars, on the faith and credit of the town, as hereinafter provided, which shall be known and designated as "Series Four of Drainage Bonds," and the money arising from their sale shall be applied and used exclusively for the construction, improvement and repair of the drains herein mentioned, which said drains shall be constructed, improved and repaired by the Board of Street Commissioners of Hagerstown in the order of priority and precedence as mentioned herein; and should said money be insufficient to construct, improve and repair all the drains herein named, yet the Board of Street Commissioners shall use and apply said money in so far as the same will allow in the construction, improvement and repair of the drains herein named each is in priority and precedence herein named:

Construction

First. A drain commencing at or near the culvert on the south side of Cannon avenue and running northward to connect with the Town Run drain, such drain in length to be about eight hundred feet.

Second. The improvement, change and repair of the drain known as the "Ladle Spring drain.

Third. A drain beginning at the West End drain on the premises of Newton Lenhar, which fronts on the north side of West Washington street, and running thence northwardly to Salem avenue to a point in and about the front of the premises of William Wallace, such drain in length to be about fourteen hundred feet.

Fourth. A drain commencing at a point in Ditto's alley, in the rear of the property of Jesse H. Hyde, which fronts on the west side of McDowell avenue, and running thence southwestwardly to the corporate limits, such drain in length to be about nine hundred feet.

Drains to be
improved or
constructed.

Fifth. A drain and the pipes thereto necessary under the bed and tracks of the Washington County branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, near West Lee street, such drain in length to be about ninety feet.

Sixth. A drain and any pipes necessary thereto, commencing on the east side of South Potomac street, near the property of D. Frank Hull, and running westwardly to Bester's drain in the alley immediately west of South Potomac street, such drain in length to be about two hundred feet.
