SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 265.

AN ACT to refund Catherine S. Philpot certain moneys erroneously paid by her to the Treasurer and Collector of Taxes for Baltimore County for and on account of State taxes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer in favor of Catherine S. Philpot for the sum of seventy-nine dollars and seventy-two cents erroneously paid by her to the Treasurer and Collector of Taxes for Baltimore County for State taxes on eleven thousand three hundred dollars Baltimore City stock for the years 1897 to 1901, inclusive, the same having received the recommendation of the Treasury officials.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 266.

AN ACT regulating certain primary elections in Harford County, in the State of Maryland.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the political parties which at the general election, November 3, 1903, polled ten per cent. of the entire vote cast in Harford County shall hereafter, in the year 1905 and biennially thereafter, nominate three candidates for all local offices to be voted for at the general election in 1905, and biennially thereafter, including the candidates for the Senate and members of the House of Delegates, by means of primary election conducted under the provisions of this Act, and not otherwise. Said candidates may be nominated by direct vote of the duly registered voters belonging to or acting with said parties in each precinct of said county, or they may be nominated by county convention, the delegates to which shall be elected at primary elections duly held in the different precincts of this county. Said elections shall be biennially held as above stated on a day to be fixed by agreement between the governing bodies
