

140. Any person who has such a child under his control and who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the preceding section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not exceeding five dollars for each offense. Failure to comply with the law.

141. Any person who induces or attempts to induce any deaf child to absent himself or herself unlawfully from school, or employs or harbors while his or her school is in session any such child absent unlawfully from such school, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not more than fifty dollars. Harboring.

CHAPTER 300.

AN ACT for the incorporation of the town of Friendsville, in District No. 2 of Garrett County, and for the amendment of Article 12 of the Code of Public Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Garrett County," by adding additional sections thereto, to be known as Sections IIIA, IIIB, IIIC, IIIC½, IIID, IIIE, IIIF, IIIF½, IIIG, IIIH, IIIJ, IIIK, IIIL, IIIM, IIIO, IIIP, IIIQ, and to follow immediately after Section III of said Article 12, and to be known by the sub-title "Friendsville," and to exempt the town of Friendsville in District No. 2, in Garrett County, as herein bounded and described from the operations of the provisions of Chapter 77 of the Acts of 1898, entitled "An Act to prohibit the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer in Election District No. 2 of Garrett County."

WHEREAS, At a meeting of the male citizens and residents of the town of Friendsville, in Garrett County, Maryland, held on the fourteenth day of January, 1904, it was decided by the unanimous vote of the residents of said town attending said meeting that an application should be made to the General Assembly for a charter for said town of Friendsville. Charter for a town.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That seventeen new sections be and the same are hereby added to Article 12 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Garrett County," under the new sub-title "Friendsville," to immediately follow Section III, to be known as Sections IIIA, IIIB, IIIC, IIIC½, IIID, IIIE, IIIF, IIIF½, IIIG, IIIH, IIIJ, IIIK, IIIL, IIIM, IIIO, IIIP and IIIQ, and to read as follows: Additional sections.
