

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the box in which the names shall be placed and which shall be used in drawing jurors for Queen Anne's County hereafter shall not be as described and designed in Section 3 of Chapter 618 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, but it shall be a box of the length of about thirty inches, width of about eight inches and depth of about five inches, to be provided by the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County, under the direction of the judge or judges thereof, and said box shall have its length divided into seven equal compartments or drawers, extending in length about the width of said box, which shall be numbered to correspond with the numbers of the respective election districts of said county, and all other laws inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 304.

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 627 of the Acts of 1902 and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Chapter 627 of the Acts of 1902 be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

45A. The County Commissioners of Howard County may receive sealed proposals for all printing and advertisements necessary for any election held in Howard County, and the proposals shall be opened and read aloud in public by the County Commissioners, and shall remain on file in their office and open to the inspection of the public. The contract for supplying during the ensuing year the printed notices and newspaper advertisements shall thereupon be awarded by the County Commissioners to the lowest responsible bidder for the same, who shall be required to do the work connected therewith, and as required by the County Commissioners or the officers of registration. But should there be no bid for said printing and advertisements, or should the County Commissioners reject any or all of said bids, which power is hereby specially given them, then the County Commissioners may apportion the printing to such paper or papers published in Howard County as they may be able to contract with; but
