

On motion of Mr. Brace,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Claims to introduce a bill for the relief of Rebecca Cresap, by refunding State and county taxes erroneously paid.

On motion of Mr. Freamer,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to amend the Acts of 1846, chapter 333, and the supplements, incorporating the Hagerstown and Waynesboro' Turnpike Company.

On motion of Mr. Freamer,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to repeal the Act of 1822, chapter 42, incorporating the First Hagerstown Hose Company, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion of Mr. Miller,

Leave was granted to the Frederick delegation to introduce a bill to repeal chapter 67 of the Act of 1872, and re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion of Mr. Etchison,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's delegation to introduce a bill for the passage of an Act in regard to fences in Prince George's county.

On motion of Mr. Groome,

Leave was granted the Cecil delegation to report a bill to authorize the County School Commissioners of Cecil county to satisfy a judgment against the Trustees of the Elkton Academy, in Cecil.
