

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of removing the remains of Maryland soldiers of the late Confederate State's Army, and interring them in Loudon Park Cemetery, and enclosing and arranging the burial lot.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 1, of Article 28, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," and re-enact the same with amendment.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Citizens' Gas Company, of Baltimore.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to add an additional section to the charter of the city of Cumberland, authorizing the Mayor and Council of Cumberland to purchase or condemn additional ground for the use of said city, for market-house and station-house.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to prevent swine from running at large in the streets, lanes and alleys of Knoxville, in Frederick county.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Cumberland and Ohio Canal Company.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to pay to Luther A. Martin, late Sheriff of Charles county, the sum of eighty-two dollars and thirty cents, erroneously paid into the Treasury.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to give and declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to the gift, legacy, devise and bequest of five thousand dollars to the Trustees of Waugh Chapel, in Baltimore county, Maryland, as contained and mentioned in the last will and testament of John Geddis, late of Baltimore county, deceased.

Also,

The bill entitled a supplement to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate a Company to make a Turnpike Road from Hagerstown, in Washington county, to the town of Sharpsburg, passed at the January session, in 1853, chapter 129.
