

the seventh section, of article eleven, of the Constitution of Maryland, sub-title "Baltimore city."

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That in order to provide the means for the purchase aforesaid, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore may issue the bonds of the city, for an amount not exceeding two millions dollars, upon such terms and conditions, and in such manner as the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore may hereafter by ordinance prescribe, providing that the said bonds shall not be issued, nor the purchase be made until the ordinance authorizing or directing the same shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Baltimore, at such time and places as are or may be fixed by such ordinance, and be approved by a majority of the votes cast at such time and places.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 478.

AN ACT to authorize George Little and Thos. V. Hunter, surviving Trustees of Wiseburg Church, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That George Little and Thomas V. Hunter, surviving Trustees of the Wiseburg Church, or their successors, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey, in fee, unto the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore county, by deed, to be executed, acknowledged and recorded according to law, so much of the property mentioned in a deed from Thomas Slade to John Wise and others, trustees, and recorded in liber W. G., number one hundred and eighty-two, folio four hundred and twelve, as, in their judgment, may be deemed necessary, the proceeds arising from such sale to be applied to the extinguish-
