MARYLAND, 30.

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on the last Monday of December, being the twenty-sixth day of said month, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, and ended the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

THE FOLLOWING LAWS WERE ENACTED, TO WIT:

CHAPTER 1.

CHAPTER 1.

An act for the benefit of Joseph Wood, former Sheriff of Calvert county.

Passed Jan. 6, 1832.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Joseph Wood, former sheriff of Calvert county, be, and he is hereby authorised to collect, until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty three, all fines, forfeitures, americiaments, officers fees, or public dues, which were placed in his hands for collection, and which have not been collected, in the same manner as he could or might have done within the time limited by law.*

Authorised to collect.

Sec. 2, *And be it enacted, That the said Joseph Wood, before he proceeds to execute the body or property of any person or persons for fines, forfeitures, americiaments, officers fees, or public dues, by the authority of this act, shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to such person or persons, chargeable with the same, at least thirty days previous to serving or levying such execution, an amount of the sum demanded of him, her, or them, with an affidavit annexed thereto, that he hath not, nor hath any other person or persons acting under him, whilst sheriff, nor since, received any part*

To furnish the amount due and affidavit.
