No. 17.

Resolution in favor of Nancy Williams.

Passed Feb 13, 1835

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Nancy Williams, widow of John Hartshorn, who was a lieutenant in the revolution, or to her order, during her widowhood, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, in consideration of the services of her late husband.*

No. 18.

Resolution in favor of Arra Marr.

Passed February 19

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Arra Marr, widow of William Marr, a soldier of the revolution, the half pay of a private, in quarterly payments, during her life.*

No. 19.

Resolution directing the Librarian to furnish certain Indices to the Laws of Maryland.

Passed February 12

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be, and he is hereby authorised to furnish two bound copies of the Index to the Laws of Maryland, from eighteen hundred and eighteen, to eighteen hundred and twenty-five; and two copies from eighteen hundred and twenty-six, to eighteen hundred and thirty-one; one copy of each to be deposited in the office of the clerk of Dorchester county, and one copy for the use of the Orphans' Court of said county.*
