To His Excellency,

Elihu E. Jackson, Governor of Maryland:

I respectfully submit to your Excellency my report of the operations of the Treasury Department during the last fiscal year ended the 30th day of September, 1890, as required by Section 9, Article 19, of the Code of Public General Laws.

RECEIPTS

89 The total revenue received into the Treasury during the fiscal year was \$5,860,604.94, and the balance in the Treasury September 30th, 1889, was \$490,727.01, making the total amount in the Treasury during the fiscal year \$6,351,331.95.

The amount of receipts in the Treasury for 1890 exceeds that of the year 1889 by \$3,793,261.23. This large excess is mostly due to the sale of the Bonds of the Exchange Loan of 1889. The receipts in detail are given in "Statement A," appended to this report.

DISBURSEMENTS.

The total disbursements during the fiscal year 1890 were \$5,684,486.01, being greater than the disbursements of the previous year, 1889, by the sum of \$3,575,799.85. This is due to the redemption of the State 5 per cent. Sterling Bonds. The disbursements in detail appear in "Statement B" of this report. The balance in the Treasury at the end of the fiscal year was \$666,845.94.
