

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That the foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State shall be, at the next general election to be held in this State in the year 1936, submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of directions contained in Article 14 of the Constitution of this State, and at the said general election, the vote on the said proposed amendment shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now prescribed by law, and immediately after said election, due returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against said proposed amendment as directed by said Article 14 of the Constitution.

CHAPTER 427.

AN ACT to add a new sub-section to Section 6 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Baltimore City," said new sub-section to be known as Sub-section 6A, title "Foreign Trade Zones," and to follow immediately after Sub-section 6, title "Fish," to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to provide for the establishment, maintenance and operation of foreign trade zones, pursuant to the Act of the 73rd Congress No. 397, approved June 18, 1934.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new sub-section be and it is hereby added to Section 6 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Baltimore City," said new sub-section to be known as Sub-section 6A, title "Foreign Trade Zones," and to follow immediately after Sub-section 6, title "Fish," and to read as follows:

6A. To make application for establishing, maintaining and operating Foreign Trade Zones in the Baltimore Harbor, and to maintain and operate such Foreign Trade Zones when established agreeable to and pursuant to the provisions of the Act of the 73rd Congress No. 397, approved June 18, 1934, entitled "A Bill to provide for the establish-
