SEC. 13. The officers of the senate and house of delegates shall be as follows, with such compensation as is hereinafter provided, and it shall not be lawful for the senate and house of delegates to increase the number or compensation of their officers, while this act continues in force, but the president of the senate or speaker of the house of delegates, when the work of their respective houses cannot be performed by the regularly appointed officers in the time required, may appoint an additional officer or officers *pro tempore*, with such compensation as may be right and proper ; *provided*, it shall not exceed that herein allowed officers with like duties.
