And the cost of such publication shall be defrayed as is now required to be done in the publication of local laws.

CONDEMNATION OF LANDS BY THE UNITED STATES.

1874, c 395, s 1. Procuring title, etc., to land within State.

1. WHENEVER the United States are desirous of purchasing or procuring the title to any tract, piece or parcel of land, within the boundaries or limits of this State, for the purpose of erecting thereon any light-house, beacon-light, range-light, light-keeper's dwelling, forts, magazines, arsenals, dock-yards, buoys, public piers, or necessary public buildings or improvements connected therewith, and cannot agree with the owner or owners thereof as to the price and for the purchase thereof; or if the owners or any of them be *feme covert*, under age, *non compos mentis*, or out of the county wherein
