

CHAPTER 492.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article twenty-seven, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," designated "two hundred and eighty-eight A."

To add. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That an additional section, designated "two hundred and eighty-eight A," be added to article twenty-seven, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," to follow after section two hundred and eighty-eight, and to read as follows:

Indictment. 288 A. In any indictment for the unlawful sale or disposition of spirituous or fermented liquor or lager beer, it shall not be necessary to specify the particular variety, provided the indictment sets forth an unlawful sale or disposition of intoxicating liquor, but the defendant, on application to the State's attorney before trial, may obtain a statement of the particular variety of liquor expected to be proved.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 493.

AN ACT to give and grant the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to sundry gifts, grants, sales, leases, devises and bequests of various persons in this State, to or for the use of sundry religious sects, orders and denominations therein named,

To sanction SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sanction and consent of the general assembly be and is hereby granted and given to the following gifts, grants, sales, leases, devises and bequests, to or for the use of the several religious sects, orders and denominations hereinafter set forth, viz:

Bequest. First. To the bequest contained in the last will and testament of Thomas C. Bosley, deceased, to the methodist preachers' aid society of Baltimore, and to the bequest contained in the last will and testament of Samuel Gamble, deceased, to the same society.

Bequest. Second. To the bequest of one thousand dollars contained in the last will and testament of Hertz Oppenheimer, late of Baltimore city, deceased, to the Hebrew chizack amuno congregation of Baltimore city, State of Maryland, therein named "Chesak amuno synagogue on Lloyd street, Baltimore city."
