Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 381 of the Acts of 1876, entitled an Act to provide for the further protection of the oyster interests in Queen Anne's county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

House bil! entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article 72 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Oysters," sub title "Fishery Force," to be designated as "Section 26 A," providing additional boats for the State Fishery Force.
