

of the Legislature of Virginia in reference to the matter of catching oysters, crabs and fish in the waters of the Potomac and Pocomoke Rivers, and to confer on the question of the boundary line on the southern side of the Potomac, five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, and the said Chairman shall report to the next General Assembly the amount expended and the vouchers."

In section 1, line 17, strike out the word "twenty-five," and insert in lieu thereof the word "twenty."

Also,

Section 1, in 2nd line of sub-division "Militia," between the words "forty and thousand," insert the word "five."

Which were concurred in.
