

SEC. 124. The clerk shall keep careful and accurate minutes of the proceedings of the Council, and record all ordinances passed in a book to be kept exclusively for that purpose, as the ordinance book, and his books shall at all times be open to the inspection of any citizen, and for his services he shall receive an annual salary not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Keep minutes of proceedings.

SEC. 125. The Council shall fix the salaries of all other officers of the town, and shall exact bonds to the town in such penalty as they may deem right for a faithful compliance of all officers with the duties imposed upon them by the ordinances and laws of the town.

SEC. 126. At their meeting for the election of officers the Council shall appoint two of the justices of the peace of the said town to enforce the ordinances thereof, the said justices to continue in office for a period of one year, or until their successors are elected.

Enforce ordinances.

SEC. 127. For the enforcement of the town ordinances the said justices shall have all the power of ordering arrests and summoning witnesses that is now vested in them by law, and they shall be entitled to demand and receive the same fees as in other criminal proceedings, but the Council may determine and fix an annual salary to be paid to said justices quarterly, and in such case they shall impose no justices' fees in the trial of cases before them. Each of said justices shall be furnished with copies of the ordinances of the town relative to crimes and punishments, and each shall keep a separate docket for corporation cases, and therein record and make regular entries of his proceedings in all such cases, setting forth the fine or imprisonment imposed and the amount of costs, and he shall submit said docket to the inspection of any person who may request to see the same, and upon demand shall deliver a copy of any judgment rendered by him. It shall be the duty of said justices to make out a summarized statement of all corporation cases tried before them, with fines and costs therein collected, which statement shall be submitted quarterly to the Council,
