Said bill, as amended, was then read the third time under the suspension of the rules, and passed by yeas and nays, as follows, with proposed amendments:

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hayes, from the Committee on Finance, reported with recommendation that said bill be referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

House bill entitled an Act to provide for the payment by the State, for certain debts contracted by the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company during 1887, 1888, 1889 and 1890, for labor, &c.

Which was considered and so referred.

Mr. Hayes, from the Committee on Finance, reported favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to prevent and punish fraudin sales of goods, wares and merchandise, at public or private sales by vendors, &c.

Which was read the second time.

House bill entitled an Act to regulate the term and compensation of the County Commissioners of St. Mary's county.
