Senate bill, File No. 218, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 3 of chapter 78 of the Acts of 1902, entitled "An Act to further amend the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1864, chapter 242, and of 1876, chapter 27, and other Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, relating to the Safe Deposit and Trust Company of Baltimore."

The Committee on Judicial Proceedings offered the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend section 1 by striking out all after the word "whatever," in line 19, to the end of the first section and insert in lieu thereof the following, "And its stockholders shall also be subject to the liability imposed by the provision of section 85 L of Article 23, Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, upon the stockholders therein mentioned."

Which amendment was adopted, bill read second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also favorably,

Senate bill, File No. 284, entitled "An Act to amend Article 27 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Crimes and Punishments,' by adding certain sections thereto to follow section 263 C, and to be known as 'Sections 263 D, 263 E, 263 F, 263 G and 263 H, and to regulate the issue and redemption of trading stamps or other similar devices.'"

Which report was adopted; bill read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
