Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays."

Also, delivered

House bill entitled an Act authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Cumberland to issue bonds to the amount of \$65,000 to the Pennsylvania Railroad Company in Maryland, and confirming an ordinance entitled an ordinance to aid the introduction of the Pennsylvania Railroad into the City of Cumberland, passed for said purpose by said Mayor and City Council, November 21st, 1877, and approved by a vote of the people of said City, December 15th, 1877.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
