ded, however, and it is hereby directed, that the directors of the said Maryland Penitentiary, and the warden thereof, shall not receive into said penitentiary any person sentenced to imprisonment by any court of any other State, or by any court of the United States, other than the courts of the United States for the District of Maryland."

Which was adopted.

Also, by Mr. McLane,

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add to the previous amendment: "And shall, in all contracts to be made hereafter for the employment of the convicts in said penitentiary, and in the sale of the manufactures of the said institution, provided that the goods so manufactured, whether under said contracts, or for sale, shall be sold beyond the limits of this State."
