## CHAPTER 927.

(Senate Bill 495)

AN ACT to repeal section 98 of Article 5 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Calvert County", sub-title "County Treasurer", and to enact in lieu thereof a new section to be known as Section 98, relating to the election and tenure of the County Treasurer for Calvert County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 98 of Article 5 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition) title "Calvert County", sub-title "County Treasurer", be and it is hereby repealed and that a new section be and it is hereby enacted in lieu thereof, said new section to be known as Section 98 and to read as follows:

98. At the general election held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November every fourth year, accounting from the year 1942, there shall be elected a county treasurer for Calvert County by the qualified voters of said county, who shall hold office for four years, and until his successor is elected and qualified, as is herein-after provided, to be subject to removal for wilful neglect of duty or misdemeanor in office upon conviction in a court of law; he shall not be eligible to re-election until after an interval of one full term and until he shall have fully settled up all business connected with his former term; and the persons elected to said office under the provisions of this section shall hold the same for four years from the first day of January succeeding their election; and the said treasurer shall in all respects be clothed with the powers given by Chapter 183 of the Acts of 1890.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1947.
