Hon. Richard C. Hollyday, Secretary of State, delivered the following message from his Fxcellency, the Governor:

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT,

Annapolis, April 1st, 1876.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

I have the honor of informing you that I have approved and signed the following Acts, which originated in the House of Delegates:

No. 204. An Act to repeal and re-enact as amended, Section 6, of chapter 79, of the Acts passed at January Session, 1874, entitled an Act for the protection of Black Bass and all other Fish in Patapsec River, above tide water.

No. 205. An Act to require the Commissioners of Prince George's county to pay annually to the Commissioners of the Village of Bladensburg, the amount of the Road Fax layied, or taxed upon property within the limits of said corporation.
