

mines, and as the miner employed at work therein proceed with the working of their excavations, it shall be the duty of the owner or lessee or agent of said mines to furnish a sufficient quantity of timber at the place where the miner is at work, and whenever the said workman engaged in said excavations shall deem it safe and proper to have any of the props or timbers removed from said excavations, it shall be the duty of the person or persons so employed by the owner or agent, to remove the said props or timbers to whatever point or place the workman engaged therein may require, but no props or timbers whatever shall be removed that might endanger the lives of any of the workmen engaged therein by such removal."

Section 11, line 7, after the word "one," strike out "thousand," and insert "hundred."

Section 11, line 8, after the word "one," strike out the word "thousand," and insert "hundred."

Make Section 12 Section 13.

Section 12. *And be it enacted*, That the mode of ventilation shall be the same as is now in use in the coal mines of Allegany and Garrett counties.

Section 11, in line 9, strike out all after the word "dollars."

Which were adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read the second time, ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, and to be reprinted as amended.
